Him and He will guide you through it all to Himself. Jesus did just this and so He is empowered to guide, also. But the Goal is to know yourself as the Absolute. Indeed, you will never know Who Jesus is until you first know Who you are. You have to know yourself before you can know another. In fact, if you know yourself, you will, ipso facto, know every "other." There will be no "other." You will have to get as religionless, even as God-less, in the sense of attributeless, as Jesus was and is. You have to know yourself as having no attributes, no qualities but being Being: Truth-Consciousness-Bliss, Father-Son-Holy Spirit, wither a second.

The Nicene Creed is a statement regarding the nature, origin and destiny of every man, woman, child, rock, plant and animal. God is all this and more -- to Whom be Glory forever and ever. Amen.

A CONCLUDING POSTSCRIPT

There is one further matter I need to mention and that is that Jesus did

not say He would come again. He said: "He Who sent me will come again,"
and, "He Who made me will come again."

This statement by Jesus has gotten twisted and turned and heaped up into a huge mess by many writers. No end of confusion has been caused by the idea that Jesus Himself is coming again. The Apostles and Evangelists did

(or, their editors did not.)

not get the statement straight, But any Christian scholar and exegete

can tell you the endless tangles that surround the notion of the Second

Coming.

Well, there is no such thing, save, perhaps, that the Army of Titus is the incarnation of the avenging aspect of the Son of Man. Jesus was forecasting the appearance of the Avatar Who is now with us. Not the Son but the Father was said by Jesus to be coming again. He has come. He is here, now itself. The Advent of the Avatar, now of some fifty plus years' duration and to last for about another forty years, is the central, all-important fact of this age. All other matters are subsidiary to this one, the Advent of the Avatar, God the Father.
