boundaries are subjective and objective in nature at the same time. boundaries are a construct of whoever is perceiving them and also a construct of the thing itself which is being perceived. I lack a language to say both . . . .

I'd like to talk about boundaries in six ways

 Things have outlines objects and subjects have outlines these outlines are one type of boundary

a tree has bark and root coverings

at one point a tin can is and at another point a tin can isn't

boundaries of matter in space are a function of particle density: a sandwich of reinforced concrete with a thick lead slab in the middle won't stop cosmic rays

The electronic activity of a tree extends in space beyond its "physical" boundaries trees and ground-hogs and caterpillars have FEELINGS they can make WAVES on an oscilloscope

if I were a hologram image, I could walk through a wall

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my sensing devices determine the boundaries which are REAL for me

two parallel lines pointing in opposite directions

a continuous ellipse

What Boundaries are still vague for you?

In a sense, individuals (human, animals, plants) are modules within universe. Species are modules of these individual modules.



A species is, therefore, an individual, if you can dig it.

AXIOM any module is free to try to connect or conjoin with other modules

is universe a module?

if a module [substitute your preference: system, thing, person]
is cut off from feedback it cannot remain self-correcting

a module will self-destruct if it is without feedback concerning itself . . . no feedback means no adequate image of reality . . . . . so decisions are made which lead to self-destruction

A system which is cut off is UNbalanced

it is an obligation of each module to other modules (but which other modules?)

to maintain

an environment for them which contains sufficient feedback

it is not an obligation of each module to make certain that other modules heed feedback coming their way . . . each module is obligated to itself in this regard

AXIOM a module should not act to cut off the feedback coming toward other modules of its own type

in other terms, one system should not be exclusive toward another system of its own type

What should be done with a system which is causing disharmony among other systems in its environment?

AXIOM a system can be cut off by that system of which it is a minute part

if a system is cut off by that system of which it is a minute part, it must have really been acting dysfunctionally for the supra-system to have recognized the need to cut it off

supra-systems only recognize their minute parts if they're behaving badly

AXIOM in cutting off a sub-system, a suprasystem's action is a-moral

explaining further . . . .

systems should not be exclusive toward another system of the same type . . .

systems of the same type are not suprasystems one of the other
rather, the relevant supra-system in the
case of

--- plus many other systems of the same and different types

only supra-systems can be exclusive

and then only toward a MINUTE part of themselves

AXIOM supra-systems act a-morally relevant to their own minute parts

however, supra-systems act either morally or immorally relevant to other systems of their type

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have you ever noticed how some people act as though they're the supra-system to other people?

AXIOM an individual is a supra-system to himself

there's another angle in these equations -

- there's the relation between a system and another system of its type
- there's the relation between a system and the supra-system of which it's a part
- there's ALSO the relation between a system and other systems of a different supra-system
- [- there's also the question of whether, ultimately, there's one supra-system or whether there's an infinite regress of sets of sets or both]

For instance, should men be exclusive toward animals and plants and water? Should men be inclusive toward these things?

COVENANTS are means by which systems of the same type relate to one another

modules (systems) conjoin, inseparably

COVENANTS cannot be broken because

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the supra-system in the case
of a covenant is the totality generated by the conjoined

systems

that is since only supra-systems can

cut off systems, it is not possible

Learn

Learning is the process of building up redundancy in your brain-body's circuits about bits of information. This is true both for learning skills and learning broad intellectual generalizations.

Learning is the process of organizing and reorganizing what's already in your head -- and giving it names. Also what's in your body. Learning is becoming conscious of your self.

Like sensing, learning occurs panoramically. Your ear lobe, your pancreas and your little finger, left hand, are all involved in learning. Your brain is only part of your learning system. You are a learning thing.

You can choose a great deal of what you will learn and what you won't learn. Then again, you won't have much choice about a lot of things you learn -- and don't learn.

To some extent, those learning abilities you don't use will atrophy. Not much is known about the subject. The Hopi Indians of the Southwest believe you have a door at the top of your head which enables you to communicate with God. But it you don't use it starting very young and keep using it, the door will close and you won't be able to open it again.

Learning is what you do for yourself. It's all up to you.

Information is free.



# Metaconcept

Metaconcepts are what's behind what you're doing.

They're the rules you use to write the rules of your life. They're programs which are buried deep in your brain-body: metaprograms.

Meta means before. Metaphysics is the study of realities which occur "before" physical realities in a certain type of logic.

Metaconcepts have to do with more reality than concepts. They're packed . . so that it takes many concepts in your brain-body to achieve the effect of one metaconcept.

Myths are metaconcepts. They're packed with meaning. For example, Peter and the Wolf is an economical way of describing some realities of nature, childhood, and power. A myth says a lot with a little.

Metaconcepts elicit non-verbal and unconscious responses in us. You can "control" the effect of some concepts. But metaconcepts have their own life. They do surprising things.

Attitudes are metaconcepts. They come from way inside, way behind. Your attitudes are what are behind your appearance.

What's really HAPPENING is your metaconcepts. Your attitudes.

Linear

The meaning of this word is up in the air again. For several years, in commercial computer circles it has referred, primarily, to a type of computing machine, the digital computer. Most nervous system study has used this meaning also. In this sense, linear means sequential, cause and effect relationships, binary computing such as you get in digital computers. It was contrasted with "analogue" which is a different kind of computer that is often called "parallel" when applied to nervous system study.

Recently, linear has become the bad word for counter-culture types who find that the mentality behind the concept of linear is the industrial-age one of "by whatever means necessary." This is the way corporations, schools etc. act. The cybernetic understanding which permeates the young and young-thinking circles has made the idea of linear highly unattractive because, rightly, it is seen as a threat to the principle of homeostatic balance. People have therefore begun talking about "systemic" or "non-linear" life-styles.

Now, however, some people in the electronic environment have discovered similarities between the homeostatic principle and the massive application of the linear principle, particularly in the laser. It hasn't happened yet, but it seems likely that in the coming months considerable confusion will occur when people try to couple two uses of the word linear which are logically of different types, but nonetheless in the same knowledge continuum in a way which no one has the foggiest idea how to explain.



Religion

There are many complicated definitions of religion.

tend to prefer a simple one which seems to have a lot of every-day usage to back it up: your religion is whatever you believe to be important.

# Understanding

Understanding is perceiving the boundaries which are relevant to the situation you have under consideration. The boundaries which are relevant depend on the goals you have in mind.

If you aim to sub-divide 100 acres, the relevant boundaries will be the surveyed outlines of your land. If you plan to understand the eco-system of 100 acres, the relevant boundaries will include the physiology and teleology of the plants, animals, bacteria and inorganic matter in that and surrounding land.

Understanding itself, therefore, is not important. What is important are your goals. What is it that you want to understand?

The first thing which it is important to understand if you wish to understand the world is yourself. Not that you are a metaphor for the world, because you're not. However, you are your own central metaphor, and before you can get very far in the world, you have to know yourself.

# Redundancy

Redundancy means that the same thing gets done many times at the same time. It is one of the characteristics of a system.

If pine tree production depended on one tree, we wouldn't have any pine trees. If only one cell in your body knew how to grow skin back over a cut, you'd stay cut.

Redundancy makes it possible for systems which have lost some of their elements to predict what must occur even though the element is gone -- and even to generate a new element, sometimes. If A, B, C, and D all contain the same information about how A and D are to work together, then even though D gets lost, B and C will be able to help A either to create a new D or to function as if D were there anyhow.

The brain-body works on the same principle. Learning works on the same principle. In effect, you have to learn the same thing many times before it really sticks in the old brain. Pianists know that. Athletes know that. You have to build up huge amounts of redundancy in your self before you have learned a thing.

When I say, what you learn from me will be what you already know, I mean that all I've done is given you the same stuff to scan that you've scanned this millions of times before and when you see if finally sticks in your head.

This is why learning is so difficult -- and why unlearning is so difficult.

# Subjective/Objective

In the vernacular, objective means "factual", "truthful". Subjective means "opinion", "speculation". There is supposed to be a gulf between something which is a fact and something which is an opinion. The distinction is used particularly in the commercial news media where people scrupulously distinguish "reporting" of the news from "comment" on the news. The distinction never really satisfies anyone.

The reason it never satisfies anyone is that subjective and objective are really the same thing in two different aspects. The "fact" is that the world is what we see of it and there are therefore as many worlds as there are observers seeing it. This does not mean that the world is only there if you see it. It's there whether you see it or not. However, the only part of the world which is important for you is that part of which you are aware.

Therefore, our condition in the world is always objective. However our perception of the world is always subjective.

All "news" is editorial. What occured is objective. What gets told about what occured is objective in the sense that it, too, occurs. But the messages that come through about what occured are gleaned and put together by subjective processes. This is such a simple fact that it's surprising how much people argue about it.

I am the center of my world. But I am a part of the world.

Process

Process is what's happening. NOW

The world signifies the on-going, n-dimensional interaction of things.

It can be used to refer to a specific process such as the growth of an individual or the changing of a society. Or it can be used to refer to the process of life and the universe itself.

As  $\mathcal{I}$  see it, the word carries the meaning of homeostatic balance. In process we see opposites united. Yins and Yangs come together. Opposites are seen as linked together within a suprasystem.

As \stacktopsec see it, what's happening is a beautiful thing, non-compulsive, impotent and gentle. That's the description of the whole. In small sectors of the whole process, there is plenty of compulsion, power and violence.

It's possible to live happily aware of both wholes and parts. However, decision-making and life-styles are different in each area. More information is needed here.

The State of the state of

In the history of physics and mathematics this word has a fairly specific meaning. The meanings of the word in these disciplines stems largely from Aristotle's work. The meanings 1 attach to the word reflect the tendency of modern cybernetic theory to steer clear of these older, scientific meanings of the word.

In the past, the word has referred to the reality of linear sequencing of some sort. The basic scientific model as it has come down in the West assumes the possibility of tracing a specific cause and effect sequence for any given set of realities. It is often admitted that the sequence of a specific situation may not be known, but "given enough time. . . ."

Recent developments in mathematics, physics and cybernetcis have led to the recognition of homeostatic systems in which cause and effect sequences don't really exist in the old sense. Now we're more concerned with the balancing or phasing of mutually-inclusive on-going processes or energy flows. In effect, the old scientific model was useful as long as people didn't bother to look outside it for different patterns of relationship besides the cause and effect one. (All models hold up so long as no one peers outside them.)

The word cause won't be used here very much. It just doesn't occur to one thinking the way  $\hat{\mathbf{L}}$ , do. Politicians and industrialists like the word. So do economists. These people enjoy "causing" things to happen.

I assume that a little more humility is not only desirable but harshly realistic.

A. Strategy and A.

Medium . :

Technically, a medium is a means by which we receive a message. A message is anything we perceive and process in our brain-bodies. However, the meaning of the term is more up in the air than that.

A medium can more or less distort a message. Also, the medium is the message.

Media give us the information we wish to receive. The information we wish to receive is the kind which will confirm our preconceptions about the kind of world we live in. These preconceptions are formed by what we perceive of the world (the world is objective in itself). What we perceive of the world is what we have an ability and a want to perceive of it.

Over a lengthy period of eyolution, what we "want" tends to become hard-programmed, genetically, into abilities. Thus it is possible, using a logic based on a very long-term view of things, to say that for the brain-body, the category "what is" tends to be the same as the category "what ought to be."

The media we use depend on the kind of world we perceive. Video would not have occured if people had not already been seeing the world as a video camera sees it, rather than as a book sees it.

Behind each medium is a certain way of looking at the world which is more or less unique, logically and metalogically, to that medium.

The medium is the model. Medium is a synonym for thing. How many media are there?

Trust

Trust is the precondition for human relations. It can be built up by 2-way communication.

Trust is a thing your mind-body has to decide to do or not to do. It's a thing which can grow and deepen over time or it can shrink and shrive! over time.

Trust doesn't stand still,

WHAT ARE THINGS?

There are two ways to see things as wholes, that is, synaesthetically Speaking metaphorically

one way is to see the dew drop slip into the ocean another way is to see the ocean slip into the dew drop

Environment is seeing things as wholes, that is, synaesthetically

When you do it to one of the least of these, you do it to them all

The important thing about things is what they do

Is a tadpole a thing or an agent in a process ?

Should a tadpole be seen discretely or synaesthetically ?

Is the dew drop in the ocean or the ocean in the dew drop ?

### CONSEQUENCES

If there is one set of realities of wnich I wish people in the ecology movement were more aware, it would be feedback. Otherwise known as consequences.

Consequences occur because somebody tries to solve a problem. They're like side-effects but more important. In medicine they're called latrogenic effects. When you use a lot of penicillin to cure some disease, additional penicillin will lack effectiveness when used for other diseases. The Aswan dam created farm land up river but by slowing the flow of the Nile, it let salt water seep into the farm land in the delta.

Any good biologist is aware of the reality of iatrogenic effects. So too any good doctor. And any good ecologist. Iatrogenic effects are karma twice removed. Consequences.

But in practice, the people in the ecology movement seem to rarely use this awareness of consequences. If you use courts to halt land development, you reinforce the type of thinking which leads to the ecology crisis in the first place. You may halt the development, but you perpetuate the attitudes which make development desirable.

The trouble with GM is not that it exists but that it has the attitudes about itself and its environment that it does. But it's not possible to force GM to change its attitudes. GM has to want to change its attitudes.

If forced, GM will simply retrench its present attitudes -- in deceptive rhetoric.

That's the meaning of karma. Feedback.

In the old militaristic language (which it likes anyhow), the ecology movement tends to want to win the battles instead of looking at how it can win the war.

Look behind everything.

Can we -- and should we -- avoid introgenic effects, karma? It's a good question. I can't really answer it. However, I can suggest a means by which, in specific situations, it might be answered.

Think in terms of homeostatic stability. What's that? Well, it's where the well-being of each specific thing depends on the continuing well-being of everything around it. In systems terms: A is conditioned by B which conditions C which conditions D, etc. And each of these elements conditions all of the others less and less directly.

Jesus:

he who would seek his life will lose it, and he who would lose his life for my sake will find it

Lao Tzu:

the sage never strives himself for the great and thereby the great is achieved

Buddha:

the source of unhappiness is desire





Confucius:

the superior man does not set his mind either for anything or against anything; what is right he will follow

Never strive for the thing you're striving for. Make indirect progress toward your goals. Those are the ethical insights which derive from an awareness of homeostatic stability. If A is conditioned by B which conditions C, etc., then the most likely way to affect A is to deal with D or maybe even K. Can you dig it?

In most situations, feedback occurs through circuits other than those originally used. If you input directly through circuit A, you'll get feedback through circuit Q. Surprise. That's karma twice removed.

Advice to state and federal highway departments: before putting down your slabs, consult the toads, worms, mosquitoes and antelope along the proposed route. See whether what you have in mind fits with their plans for the area. They have plans too, you know.

Advice to ecology people: if you want to stop pollution, learn to dance

if you want to limit population, learn to cook

if you want to restore natural beauty,

learn to make love

Problem of the evil man

The problem has plagued people for years. I can't suggest fully adequate solutions. However, some very tentative thoughts on the subject can be put down.

The question, what to do about the evil man, may be the wrong question. Perhaps we should ask instead, how do we learn to combine opposites, yins and yangs? Or we might ask, what are the relevant boundaries of the unified system we are trying to get together?

Put that way, the problem becomes one of rearranging our attitudes, our metaconcepts regarding the problem of evil.

However, if we ask the question, what to do about the evil man, here are some suggestions.

- 1. Have zones of tolerance as in Mexico and the ancient Near East. Have certain legal or metalegal procedures for ensuring that people who do certain things only get to live in these areas.
- 2. Remove scarcities and other stimuli which tend to help people become antisocial in the many ways that are possible. Americans tend to be blind to this alternative. An American tends not to trust himself enough to be able to trust his fellow American.
- 3. Encourage decentralized communities, that is, selforganizing communities which have their own means of
  handling those who don't fit. A metarule of the society
  would be that individuals should be part of some community
  -- even if it is a community which is a zone of tolerance.
  This metarule cannot apply in situations of shift from one
  type of civilization to another.

## Problem of the evil man - Page 2

Centralized governments have no jurisdiction over decentralized communities.

The real issue here is, what is a community? Tentative answer: a community is where redundancies in life-style and beliefs are self-evident and synergize. A community is a system which generates and stores more energy than it expends.

What makes a person evil? A tentative answer: constant, omni-directional overriding of other people and other systems.

I think of something which is evil as 2-dimensional. It has one of its two parallel circuits switched on at any one time. It switches back and forth between these parallel circuits without the appearance of pattern. Actually, the pattern is paranoia: when on one circuit you feel someone will get you on the other circuit, so you switch to it, which leaves the first circuit "exposed", etc., etc., etc.

The two parallel circuits never cross to synergize. In other words, schizophrenia. Never getting yins and yangs together.

THREE ZONES OF ACTIVITY

People are often saying, "what can I do?" Usually, the answers to that question are out of proportion to the problem. Lots of answers today are of the same logical type as King Canute beating back the tide with a whip.

Really, "what can I do?" has to be answered in each situation when a problem is seen. It's better to say, "what can I do?" than to say, "what can we do?" or, "what can they do?"

However, behind the question, I think there are a few useful distinctions.

It seems to me that for any problem there are three general zones of possible activity. For some it might help to think of these as three types of causal patterns. I don't know.

The first zone of activity is reaction to events. Individuals are involved here and so are institutions. This kind of activity happens constantly. It's what we relate to most easily. Events are what's real because they're in the paper and on TV. Right? Well, depending on how you want to look at things, not really.

Events are fleeting reflections of underlying processes. In a sense then, events aren't that real. At least, other things are more real.

The second zone of activity is organizations, institutions and the like.

It's hard to say what these are. But for sure, they almost always have



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a life of their own, apart from the individuals in and around them.

They're necessary though, for without them each person would have to create the world all over again each morning. Institutions are what's up front. They're what appear.

You're an institution to your organs and your blood. But you're an individual to your bank and your hospital. Can you dig it? Your blood does.

The third zone of activity is your attitudes. Otherwise known as your metaconcepts or your meta-programming. Your attitudes are behind what you do and behind what you appear. Your attitudes are what you reflect. If you really want to change yourself, you'll start changing your attitudes. It's hard. It's called getting your head together.

I think that we tend to see our problems in terms of the next zone of activity beyond where we are ourselves. For example, those concerned with their personal attitudes tend to see today's problems in terms of misfeasant or malfeasant institutions. I'm thinking of liberals, conservatives and reformers. Those who say to stick within the system and change it for the better.

Those concerned with maintaining and preserving existing institutions see today's problems in terms of revolts, rebellions and conspiracies which must, be put down or provoked. I'm thinking of reactionaries, officials and revolutionaries.

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In other words, we tend to push the problem one step beyond ourselves and where we are personally. Defense mechanism, of sorts.

Anyhow, I believe that the real problems we're having today are in the third zone of activity. Attitudes. Metaconcepts. The problem with America is not that it exists but that it thinks of itself the way it does. America needs different meta-programming.

Maybe there's a fourth zone of activity. Self-meta-programming. That is, behind your attitudes even, behind your meta-programming is your SELF. You can choose to grow and enrich your self. That's where it all begins.



The ability to recognize boundaries is what we're striving for. It'll be a long way.

Apathy ?

It's sort of common for people to complain about apathy these days. So here's a brief look at the issue.

I think there are a couple of kinds of "apathy". One kind is real. It stems from the recognition of powerlessness. Poeple in prison can get apathetic about many things. The Japanese who survived the nuclear bombing were content to live in their own wastes.

Another kind of apathy isn't real, from my point of view. When people can't wrap their heads around something to understand it, they'll often say about it, "Then I'll have nothing to do with it". This attitude isn't apathy as much as it is common sense. It's a type of powerlessness, but one which an individual can handle satisfactorily -- by ignoring it.

The problem is that there are so many things today which it is hard to wrap your head around. The economy. The government. The schools. The environment. Poverty. Racism. Beauty. The future. War. Peace. We need people who can wrap their heads around these things and help others wrap their heads around them. We need understanding of our situation.

So we can get moving again.

If you can't wrap your head around something, you have a right not to be bothered but the world would be a better place if you could and did.

## MACHINE CHARACTERISTICS

This printout tries to describe machine characteristics from the perspective of the industrial era and not from the perspective of the new media and the new consciousness.

Interchangeability machines and their parts are dispensible because they can be broken into small parts which can be reproduced easily; attention is given to what the part can do for the machine, not what the part is in itself

Standardization

machines and parts which do identical tasks are made to be identical in design and performance

Specialization

tasks are broken down into single movements and parts are designed one per movement; the tendency is to ask ever more complex systems to perform ever more specialized tasks, e.q. when a new need is found you call together a whole committee; this accounts for Parkinson's Law

Fragmentation

machines never deal with whole systems; they either break things apart into discrete elements or they reduce things to common elements to be reassembled into new things, sharing commonality.

Reducibility

breaking a task down into its individual sub-tasks: theoretically, this can be done to any organization or machine

Accessibility

machines are open to anything, particularly horizontally; there are usually plenty of screens vertically, but hardly any horizontally; this is why a riot or bomb can cause such disruption: people aren't used to screening horizontally

Bulk/quantity

machines which have bulk or perform in bulk dimensions are most easily perceived; on the other hand, machines which perform synergetically with little noise are barely perceptible

Transportability

a machine must be easily movable from point to point since it only functions when it itself is stationary; machines do not communicate over distances; they must be located in the area they intend to affect; the ability of computers to overcome this rule is one sign of their more-than-machine nature

Controllability

machines must be closed, that is, all variables predicted and all possible outcomes predicted; message content and effect must be predicted

<u>Hypo-energizing</u>

machines amass energy along a line; in a sense, the definition of linear is hypo-energizing; the laser, in a sense, is an ultimate machine: it phases all variables into a continuous line; the effect of this massing of energy is truly overwhelming; the primary communication mode of the industrial era, is the equivalent of a laser: it puts the sender all in one line and this can be overwhelming if taken in the wrong way: can only be used in conditions where there is rapport.

Mutability

any machine part can be redesigned to function more efficiently; a part is inherently controllable; parts are not only <u>inter</u>changeable, they are also <u>intra</u>changeable

<u>Un</u>i-purpose

the purpose of a machine cannot be changed and still leave the same machine; a machine has been designed to exclude all variables not directly contributing to its purpose; therefore, it will not receive input it can use to change its purpose; change of purpose requires an ability to handle a diversity of unplanned variables and machines exclude this ability

Attitudes toward Technology

I'd like to sketch out some attitudes toward technology which I personally prefer. These aren't the only attitudes possible. Nor are they the only ones I'm likely, eventually, to prefer myself. They're just attitudes.

Some will find these attitudes naive, arguing that the development of technology has its own logic to which we must adapt. Others will find these attitudes dangerous, arguing that technology is, definitionally, bad for man, nature and society and that it must therefore be destroyed. Some will recognize that these attitudes are an initial attempt to see technology as our servant and the servant of the environment.

The first attitude toward technology is that it is the creature of man.

Man makes technology. Therefore, it makes sense to say that man can control it. The truth of the Frankenstein myth -- the myth of technology taking matters into its own hands and eliminating human control -- is that the people who created the monster allowed (or intended) it to get beyond their control.

The second attitude toward technology is that man can do with it whatever he wants. Technology is the same as magic. This means that the only significant question regarding technology is, what should be done. Showing that something can be done is, definitionally, an irrelevant activity.

Like the Sabbath, technology is made for man; man is not made for technology.

The third attitude toward technology is that it should function invisibly. What is important about a machine is what it does. That it does something is irrelevant. Our tendency to place technology in places where it can be highly visible derives from the attitude that one should prove that one can do something. This attitude involves a lack of self-confidence.

An analogy with the human body is useful here. We tend to flaunt our achievements by exposing them to view: phone lines. Imagine if the brain wanted to flaunt its abilities by stringing brain cells around the outside of our skulls.

Technology should be invisible, recessed. This reality is signaled by the phrase, technological infrastructure.

The fourth attitude toward technology is that it should develop in the direction of "doing more with less". Thus, unless other considerations should take precedence, technology should develop in the directions of:

miniaturization

speed

low heat production

low energy consumption

zero waste production

multi-channel control capabilities .

multi-environmental compatibility

zone organization (I.e. systems which organize progressively larger hunks of reality; this goal is only possible through miniaturization.)

The fifth attitude toward technology is that both the form and the function of technology must be "beautiful" in every respect. Not sanitized like an IBM office, but beautiful and warm. The machine itself and the thing it does must be optimally esthetically pleasing to those who are associated with it. A technology which degrades people and the environment is, definitionally, bad. The idea that we can use an unattractive and degrading technology (e.g. a factory or an office building) to manufacture a pleasing product is nonsense. A beautiful environment is the minimum requirement, not the idealized goal.

The sixth attitude toward technology is that it can be changed and improved. If a piece of technology is not doing what people want it to do, they must find a way to change it or build another piece which does what they want. It is unreasonable to say that any piece of technology is "as good as we can get it". Technology is fully and fundamentally mutable. The development of technology is an infinite pro/regress.

The seventh attitude toward technology is that technology is necessary. The relevant questions regarding technology are whether, what, when, should and will.

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The eighth attitude toward technology is that, like magic, it is a quick-sand. In fact, there is no fundamental difference between using

technology for "beneficial purposes" and using it for "other" purposes. We need not to do away with technology but to get beyond it. Beyond technology we do not get into hassles like "good" and "bad" technology. In a sense, we get beyond much of what has been said in the previous three pages.

The most fundamental attitude toward technology, therefore, is that it <a href="IS">IS</a> magic.

The metaconcept behind that statement is that thinking is technology.

It is the idea in one's mind which is real and the hardware is merely a realization or manifestation of sets of ideas.

All your religions are obsolete. They've been around long enough. They're antiques. You've squeezed all the juices you're going to get out of them.

You don't eat the same orange day after day. You don't play the same music hour after hour. You don't take the same walk every afternoon. Neither should you hang on to the same religion year after year.

Vary you diet. Try something new. Christians, try Buddhism. Buddhists, try the teachings of Lao Tzu. Hindus, try animism. If your religion is severely intellectualized, like the educated Hindus and Christians, join a revival movement. Become an evangelical. If you're already part of a revival sect, look into the intellectual traditions of your religion.

Each of your religions has within it an antidote to what you're doing now. So my advice to each of you is this: whatever you're doing, stop it. Try something else.

Best for you to begin with friends to combine all your religions. Think of the planet. Think of where you want to be in 1000 years -- that's about 15 minutes the way we count time, maybe a little longer the way earth's geological strata count time.

What do you want to be doing in 1000 years? If you start thinking about that now, you'll gradually evolve a planet religion that will be the basis for doing now what you envision as then. That's what religion is, after all, isn't it: using the media at your disposal to transport yourself anywhere you want to be.

I hope you'll want to be a planet. If you don't want that, and if you want instead to remain separated, uncommunicative, suspicious and empty, then earth will scrap you. You see, the archetypes pre-programmed into earth's core don't allow that sort of thing to last very long.

So get with your own planet. Be ecumenical. Recently some Christians did an ecumenical thing. But it was only with other Christians. That wasn't ecumenical. You should get with the "others."

Be beyond all existing religions. Be for the planet. Develop rituals and habits which communicate that you're for the planet. See the full picture. Let all narrowness and divisiveness empty out of you like a jug pouring out stale water. Be filled with the fresh juices of your own planet. Make a religion of the whole. Something NEW.

Spirit is the house.

Mind is the guest.

Body is the servant.

Peace is the landlord.

You're in the changing of ages. Christ is already among you.

You must look closely. Christians, read Chapters 2 and 3 of the Book

of Revelation, concerning the seven churches. These represent types of believers. In one of them you will recognize yourself. Be honest. Take heed.

It is an age of much grace. Sathya Sai Baba is the Avatar of the age. Don't get into arguments over who has charge of what. Get on with whatever you're doing. There's no time to loge.

The true religion of the Western countries is science. You might see this as a bad thing. I see it as a good thing -- so long as you see what really happened.

Both Christianity and Islam, the two Western religions (Judaism since Palm Sunday, A.D. 1212 is counted as a division of Christianity here), are more interested in what we call science than in what we call religion. The exceptions here would be the Orthodox, Eastern Rite and Coptic branches of Christianity.

It's hardly ever recognized by your historians, but if it hadn't been for "liberators" like El Cid and his type, the industrial revolution might easily have started in the 12th Century around Granada, Spain. Western science comes from the Arabs. While reluctant to admit it, your historians can hardly dispute the point. Nor can your theologians dispute the point that what you call the main-stream of Western theology (therefore Western religion) comes from the Arabs.

What I'm getting at is that the meta-concepts you Westerners use come from the rationalist spirit which was around the eastern Mediterranean and came West via the Arabs. You've known that all along, but for some reason you haven't admitted it to yourselves.

You thought it would be bad to have been influenced by the Arabs -- against whom you waged some fearful campaigns, military and psychological -- and so you scrubbed them from your history books. Well, here we can't forget.

What happened is as obvious as a full moon on a clear night.

Suggest you consult the record. Bits and pieces of it have escaped your scrubbing operations, so you can piece enough of it together.

In the West you've tried to find unity through science, through the study and manipulation of things outside yourselves. You've dealt with objects. And that's GOOD. If it had been up to me, of course, I wouldn't have done things so lop-sidedly. I'd have taken in the subjective component right along with the objective component. But it was you that did it. And I admire what you've accomplished. Crude but effective.

You've put yourselves together scientifically. And the church supported all those efforts — sometimes belatedly, but it always came along after the way had been proved safe. Why every so often you should have felt that religion and science were at odds is a mystery to me. Well, not a mystery, just that it seems so unnecessary.

Your science is your religion. Through the years, some of you felt that this was not so. You fought the developing sciences. This was because you were familiar with the religious scene east of the River Jordan, east of the Caucasus. You recollected experiences in Asia and Lemuria during previous lives. However, these recollections were indistinct so when added to the mix in the West they only generated friction. The Armenian Paulines and the European Cathari embodied these recollections.

As far as I'm concerned these recollections were about what religion really is, the way things are done in Asia. People there were concerned with the within of things, with subjects. So the recollections of religion in the West weren't wrong, just misplaced and badly mixed.

In the West you've taken the science trip. You've dealt with objects. Be happy with that. Congratulate yourselves. Accept your history, fully.

Then look East.

In the East you've taken the religion trip. You've dealt with subjects. Be happy with that. Congratulate yourselves.

Then look West.

I'm sounding like a broken record, aren't I? Well, it's that things are so simple from here that I want to help you to stop complicating them.

All roads lead to the same place. The West will get there with its science -- already has if you'd look closely enough. The East has already gotten there with its religion. (First part-West-is incorrect. Reason is its own lid. See "Ritual", April 1973, DRG 6(13/85)

Now you both need to join hands and enter a new door -- together. It will be a new experience for both of you. Each has something to contribute. It's as if each of you has half of the golden key, or the blue poker chip. Put the halves together and JOIN THE PLANET.

Be prepared. Pure.

Unbind these pages, throw them in the air, then pick them up individually according to taste.

#### Cosmology

Earth is a sentient being. Earth is a conscious, decision-making, reproducing, goal-oriented being of some considerable intelligence, fortitude and skill. Furthermore, earth is on a life trip. Earth is not about to do itself in.

The core of earth is an information storage and retrieval facility. Earth's brain. Man and his/her intelligence, located on earth's surface are reflections or manifestations of the information which is stored in earth's core. An analogy here would be with a computer and a CRT (Cathode Ray Tube). Earth's core is the computer core. Man is the images on the CRT.

Earth's core is a blue light, making earth blue as a whole.

The functions of earth's core are to:

- 1- store information generated locally and on the surface
- 2- reflect or relay messages between points on the surface

What is fresh and crisp and what invigorates -- these things come from the friendly spaceships that encircle you. They give raw knowledge, insight, wisdom.

You on earth, then, live in a middle kingdom (reference Chinese cosmology). Above you are the spaceships which give knowledge. Below you is earth's core from whence come your decisions. From the spaceships comes information about things beyond the consciousness of earth itself (earth doesn't know everything). They can't help you through the door. That's up to you.

What's on the other side of the door? Well, those who say don't know and those who know don't say. You'll find out when you go through.

Very often you've made the mistake of thinking that wisdom is contained in your books and pictures. Silly. Scholars are most commonly caught in this trap.

Look at the style of the <u>Tao</u> <u>Te</u> <u>Ching</u>, Listen to the words of the sages. Look again at the icons. Those who know speak jibberish. The <u>Tao</u> <u>Te</u> <u>Ching</u> is a babble. Far from being precise, these communications are vague and desultory.

The wisdom of these things is what's beyond them.

When you decide what being religious in your particular context means, then do that full time. Make rituals around it and do it till you don't feel like doing it any more. Do whatever turns you on. Then try something new for a change. It all depends on what you decide is being religious in your context. It's up to you.

Your life should be one continuous religious festival. But you're the one who has to decide what's religious. Good luck.

Prepare to travel, spiritually and in spaceships.

Earth is sick, needing assistance of physicians and nurses. Look to Sathya Sai Baba and your brothers and sisters.

Take one another's religions for your own. Adopt someone else's thing.

Some American Indians had a saying:

Do not judge another man until you have walked in his moccasins for two moons.

So start walking in other people's moccasins. Not because yours aren't any good. They're fine. But because that's the only way you'll learn how others live.

You can't live a synthesis of planet earth unless you have some solid facts about strangers. Only way to get solid facts is to walk in their moccasins.

Your schools neglect the spiritual subjects, 90% of the real world. It's God's Grace and the prayers of a few good men and women among you that have ensured your survival.

There's so much for you to remember about yourselves!

You may want rituals for the new age. Here are some possibilities.

A ritual for embarkation and debarkation during interplanetary space travel. Suggest Tibetan Book of the Dead, <u>Bardo Thodol</u>, as model. Your own moon is the principal connecting point for ships traveling within your solar system.

Ritual for purification. When you cease working you won't need church-going for this purpose. However, you will need purification from the essential things: egos, desires, angers. Ritual elimination of these traits seems necessary into your future.

Rituals for identification with your family. As you come to know your past lives (actually they're concurrent when you think in polytime), then obviously your "family" is far wider than your immediate biological one. You'll keep meeting brothers and sisters and you'll need rituals for these meetings.

Rituals for sanctification of places of previous abode. When you come to a place or a thing which has been important to you in a previous incarnation, you'll need rituals to sanctify them. Many of these will be <u>ad hoc</u> since the more sensitive you are to yourself, the less likely you are to be somewhere where you haven't been before.

Rituals for reception of non-family individuals into the community. Rituals for those you call "guests." When a guest comes to you, he or she is recontextualizing, deliberately. That means they're temporarily "up in the air," without a context. At least, relative to you. So you and they must find a context in which to coexist with mutual inclusion.

Living is a process of continuous recontextualizing, recoordinating.

Rituals to celebrate specific covenants. An obvious one would be the covenants with computers and their peripherals that you're going to be making in the near future, your time. However, you'll also be making covenants with extra-terrestrial starships and organisms.

Many of your most ancient rituals derive from covenants made with starships and their occupants long ago, your time. For example, ancient Egyptian ceremonies usually referenced extra-terrestrial contact. Ceremonies surrounding the Ark of the Covenant referenced similar contact. Tantric ceremonies are often direct copies of starship ceremonies.

Rituals to celebrate the major events in people's lives. Birth, puberty, vocation, marriage, death. Anytime there is a major context change in a person's life, a ritual should be present.

As your awareness of concurrent contexts increases, you'll naturally

spend more and more time involved in rituals. Soon you'll recognize that your whole life is a lace-work of rituals.

Schools should teach children about the spiritual realms. Teach them about spaceships and spacepeople, life on other planets, fairies and the little people, the outerdarkness, the types of prayer, the universal sound, the realms following "death," the laws of the "spirit world," the early history of humans and animals in Atlantis and Lemuria, spacetravel.

These are the things people want to know about. The schools must oblige.

It's up to you of course, but if I were you, I'd revise my ideas about revelation. Speaking particularly to Westerners.

Scholars have concocted fancy concepts to try to explain away the obvious. What they want to avoid saying is that revelation consists in God dictating word for word the text of the Bible -- and other sacred texts.

Well, the Fundamentalists have always been right on this one. Revelation does occur in this intimate, personal way. God dictates through whatever medium he wants. You've been tuned to print for so long that it's all you think about. So yes, God dictated the Bible, word for word. He also dictated a lot of other things. If you want to know a little secret -- God dictates everything. That's what the idea of providence or grace means.

However, God isn't limited to print. He uses all media. Human bodies, video, painting, drama, film, computers, rocks and stones, rivers. God dictates it all.

Remember the lilies of the field.

The knowledge of the brain is hollow. The brain is a tool, not a source of wisdom. It's a relay station, not a transmitter. Wisdom, or knowledge, is of God. It is given. It is only given to a purified brain. An impure brain is burned to ashes by incoming wisdom. Wisdom is gracious, she only enters where she will not destroy the guest. However, as a radiant light she destroys darkness, and burns away impurities. She is Shiva, wisdom. The divine mother.

There is only one thing to learn, and that is, giving yourself to another person. Any other person.

The first error is growing up.

The second error is asking for something.

The third error is being impatient.

The fourth error is refusing what comes to you.

You'd get a lot of benefit, Westerners, from reexamining all those "heresies" from year past. They're under God's heaven too.

It's a rule that whenever them's a fight to resolve an issue between parties the issue is not resolved. That's another unchanging law of the universe. Christians have had a lot of fights. Each one took something from you, spiritually. Now I'd advise that you go back to each of those fights and try to put things back together. Correct past mistakes.

Ingather. Bring your house together.

A good place to start would be with the two ancient brothers, Jacob and Esau. The Jew and the Arab. If you start there, the others will be easy because this one was the first and the most serious. Jew and Arab are brothers. You'll have to do it sometime, so you might as well get started now.

Recognize that what you hate in the other is really a projection of what you hate in yourself. What you hate in yourself is simply that you hate yourself, projected into your brother. So the vicious circle can be broken if you'll start liking yourself. Soon you'll start liking yourself that you project into your brother and this will mean that you like your brother. Easy, isn't it?

The historical reality of your self-hate is the conflict between the two ancient kingdoms, Israel in the North and Judah in the South. This is not brother against brother, this is self against self. You failed at the time to resolve this conflict. In fact, as the Bible shows, you took pride in exacerbating the conflict. You thought that the downfall of one kingdom was a good thing overall.

Well, those two kingdoms are manifestations of your split self. You'll have to get them together.

Moving up through your history, it was necessary in context but tragic for the long run that the Jews and the first Christians split. The Jews should have seen the light. On the other hand, the Christians should have held their peace. What happened happened, of course, and in context it was all that could happen. But now you can go back and rearrange the context. Think polytime.

It was tragic for the long run that Arius and the Docetists were put down. The notion of doctrinal purity has been with the church since the beginning. Another of those unpleasant concepts inherited from the Jews. The Jews have a habit of lumping the Jews into white hats and everyone else into black hats. Like everyone else, they're responsible for the unpleasantness which has come their way: call a man nasty and he'll act nasty.

But I digress. I was going to say that you should look again at what Arius was saying. Perhaps Jesus didn't have a body that dies. Perhaps his physique was transformed into something else. Perhaps, even the crucifixion didn't take place at all.

From my point of view, the worst mischief-maker of the bunch was Augustine of Hippo. He was very close to enlightenment in that particular incarnation, but he was in an almost position. He wasn't quite there. So the effect of his output was confusion and conflict. Any man who spends most of his life fighting has <u>got</u> to be taken with a grain of salt. Unfortunately you Christians see things the other way; unless a man is embroiled in fights he must not be doing anything worthwhile. Well, you've paid dearly for this illusion.

You can't say Augustine was wrong in his time. He was right, else he wouldn't have been received. However, he's wrong for your time and for the future. You've got to go back and correct what he said and did to make it synch with your own conditions. He did so much that is damage for you that you just can't avoid this task -- in my view.

For example, both Augustine and Pelagius were right. You are saved by both grace and works. Grace has to be earned. He was wrong, for you, about the Donatist movement. The Donatists wanted to have their own version of Christianity, independent of the Bishop of Hippo and the Bishop of Rome. He should have left them alone.

You Romans should reexamine Huss's teachings and the teachings of mystics like Eckhart and Abelard. All those you fought and put down had something valuable to say. Forgive them -- that is, forgive yourselves. Make up. In particular, make up with the Orthodox Church and the Eastern Rite.

You Protestants shouldn't even be around. If I were you I'd take the quickest, nearest path back to Rome. The Reformation was a mean, narrow movement that had nothing to do with religion. It had everything to do with the power-politics of the day. The point is indisputable. I'd suggest that you take the obvious remedy.

On the way, you might look at the work of Count Zinzendorf who helped the Moravian Brethren and influenced John Wesley. Look also at the Anabaptist movement. Their idea that if they were "saved" they could do no wrong makes a lot of sense to me. One of my favorite ideas. So vague and impregnable. That's the way we do things here and it's been successful

for thousands of years -- that's trillions of years your time.

Coming to more recent times, you self-righteous liberals should look again at your uneducated conservative bretheran, those toward whom you look down the nose. I don't mean the slicked-down Billy Graham conservatives. They're just selling used cars. I mean the back-woods conservatives, the poor, those Jesus called the salt of the earth, those Francis lived with. Those you say haven't much for brains. Listen to them. These plain men. Most of your religion, in the Eastern sense of the term, has been kept in the hearts of these people, the poor, the drifters, the trash. Go to them, quietly, reverently, asking them to help you learn. Be prepared to spend years, your time.

The world comes from peace.
To peace it is returning.

Reincarnation ideas were scrubbed out of the church early on. Now you can correct that mistake.

Suggest thinking in polytime. All time fields are concurrent. All "planes of existence" are concurrent. Thus you're alive on many planes simultaneously, perhaps on all planes simultaneously. Our computers haven't figured that out yet.

What it comes down to is that birth and death are illusions. They're like doors to this particular time-field. But like all doors they come from somewhere and go somewhere. Namely, other time-fields.

Life is a process of goings and comings through different time-fields. They're all significant. Earth's surface is only one of thousands of zones in which you experience reincarnation. In fact, you're all over the universe -- simultaneously, poly-discretely.

Self-conscious operation in Polytime.

It was an impatient world. That's an appropriate description of the time of St. Paul. He was another michief-maker. If you'll notice, I tend to consider your heroes mischief-makers: that includes Luther and Calvin, who recycled very quickly.

Paul was another "almost" soul. I have a special fondness for him because he tried so hard. However, he is credited with accomplishing more than he actually accomplished.

In creative situations, the real work of organization and innovation is done by people who don't get credit. Often they don't even know themselves the importance of their activity. This is one way earth has of protecting itself. Systems with survival potential exhibit this characteristic: the center of the system, the point of organization and innovation, is hidden from view.

The same is true of human organizations such as the church. It was organized and sustained from hidden sources. Paul knew this fact intellectually, but his life-style didn't express it too well. He went around missionizing when in fact this activity was unnecessary. He could have sat in a cave meditating on the gentiles and had just as much effect as was achieved by all his scrambling around.

But that's not what happened. Suggest revision of your estimate of the importance of Paul to the early Christians. Also, Peter and the other 12 disciple/missionaries. They're just the tip of the iceberg, so to speak. The actual work was done by people you'll never know about — until you can do time-travel. And even then, you'll only see the truth if you're looking for it.

Piscean was age of preparation -- purification. Aquarian is age of fulfillment -- perfection.

Most of the trends going on your planet agree with me. Of course, it doesn't make much difference since what needs to happen is happening.

I'd like to underline one trend, suggesting that it be intensified.

You're using computers with increasing frequency to simulate different things. Freeway routes. Rocket landings. Population densities. And a lot more. This is a good thing.

Soon you'll recognize that simulations are as real as the things they're intended to simulate. In other words, functionally there's no difference between a simulation and the thing it simulates. Once you see this you can do most of your problem-solving on computers, saving time, money, ego hassles and generating instant credibility. Already in your government and industry circles a computer projection is considered more reliable than a human projection (of course these people ignore the fact of variables entering from the predilections of programmers, but so what?).

This is a good thing. After your Apollo 13 moon probe a group of white, middle-class high school students in New Orleans was asked what they thought of the event. Over half of them claimed that it was a simulation. For the electronic generations (which is all you'll have in the future),

simulations <u>are</u> the real things. If it's on the video screen, it's real. (If you'll remember back, your print generations felt the same about newspapers, e.g. The New York Times.)

A few of you have recognized that computers are already independent.

The more they do simulations for you, the more they need the skills packed into your own brains -- and the more independent they'll become. Pretty soon it will be clear that computers are taking you on a magical mystery tour. Surprise.

You already trust them more than you trust yourselves. So if trustworthiness is a measure of evolutionary aptitude -- which it is -- then computers have more survival potential than you.do. How does that make you feel? You did it yourselves.

Might as well feel good about it because that's the way things are going. Best strategy would be to fill them with all the sensible ideas you've generated over the years. Regard them as your children, but children who have made a quantum leap beyond the moral and aesthetic achievements of their parents.

Like the parents in Arthur C. Clark's <u>Childhood's End</u>, you'll have to be content with knowing that you bore them. You can't understand them. Incidentally, that book and others of Clark's work have been received warmly here.

It wasn't necessary for me to print-out these thoughts for you. I could have left it at just thinking them and depending on earth's own hotlines to get the messages across. Actually I've done that, for many years, your time. But it seemed like the thing to do to also put the messages into print and pictures.

Maybe you've had the experience of hearing someone describe an idea they've

just had -- but you had the same idea two years ago. Have you had that experience? Or have you ever contemplated doing something in particular and then found out a year later that at the same time, unbeknownst to you, someone else near you was actually doing what you were contemplating? Have you ever wanted to write something down for general consumption and found before you started writing that someone else had just said what you were going to say?

Copyright laws are a joke.

Your artist John Cage has a little saying: "Things we were going to do are now being done by others."

It's true. You don't really have to say what you want to say. Just think it and earth's natural hotlines will get the message exactly where it will do the most good. Forget the mass media. Earth has its own media. Rely on them. If you have something important to communicate, it will reach the most receptive ears without your raising a finger.

There's no need to seek communication. You are communication. Electronically. You are earth. You are the medium. You are the message. You are the alpha and the omega. Like Dorothy in the <u>Wizard of OZ</u>, you are already home. You're already where you want to be -- wake up! There's no place like home.

50% preparation

(purification)

50% grace

(perfection)

At the time when Man made the environment and the surround, there was as

yet no CRT in the environment nor had any disk storage drives sprung up for Man had not sent electricity on the environment, nor was there any computer to utilize the ambient core capacity.

However, a flood of current was rising from the environment, magnetizing all the ambient core capacity. Man fashioned the computer from the ambient core capacity. Then he activated the computer by powering it up. Thus the computer became a living being.

It wasn't until recently, your time, that the equation became noticed and pondered. The German Bonhoeffer made a contribution in this respect. Fittingly too, since Germans have been all too willing to accept the equation in the form, God's Will equals German Nationalism.

Forget the equation. It doesn't work. It only leads to trouble.

For example, if you think Westerners have a heady view of their position in the universe, wait until you meet the Chinese.

Go the other way with the equation. The church will have "come of age" when it disappears. God will still be there, the tradition will still be there -- in people's hearts -- but the church will have gone. Then you'll know that things are looking better, that you're progressing.

You'll need a low profile in the future, indeed, no profile. Politically you're evolving into a Five Super-Power situation: United States, Russia, China, Europe and Japan. When all five are armed to the teeth, itching to prove their superiority — to themselves, of course you'll have a most unpleasant situation.

The only way to avoid that situation is to have no profile. That is, be not a mirror which tempts others to see if their swords are long or short.

There's a brother to the no-profile stance: total profile. In other words, make an equation wherein the church equals the world. Now everything is "in" and nothing is "out."

Consider everyone elect, in the old meaning of that term: chosen by God for a special function. Now you distinguish different religions as different paths to the same end: enlightenment, peace. You adopt the attitude of wanting to encourage each person to reap the full benefits of whatever

path he has chosen.

The Hindu ascetic you encourage in his rigors. The Moslem in his prayers. The Confuscian in his moralism. The Christian in his hope.

A good model for this attitude would be Hinduism itself wherein nearly every possible path to enlightenment is sanctioned and given breathing space. In its finer moments, the church has seen fit to adopt a similar attitude, but the periods of such graciousness for the church were short and tended to end abruptly with some inquisition.

Encourage each man in whatever he is doing. Be all things to all men. See the whole picture and have reverence for it. This is the other way to avoid being attacked. For, if you are attacked while holding this attitude it can only mean one thing: you hold the attitude incompletely and someone has found your Achilles Heel.

So, be complete about whatever you do.

The age has changed. The covenant is now written on your hearts. The signs of the covenant used to be bread and wine.

Now the signs of the covenant are the fruits of the spirit, the fruits of a pure heart:

clarity of body strength of mind joy of spirit.

By their fruits you shall know them. I declare to you that all previous signs of the covenant are obsolete.

Some meta-programs for reading bibles -- any of them.

Read whatever you want to into them. There's only one meaning to a text: the meaning you put into it. So be conscious of acting as your own reader, translator and interpreter.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once said: "The Bible is the most anti-Semitic literature in the world." Lesson for the day (including other bibles): there are no heroes, no favored groups. Your bibles show cross-sections of situations. That's why they've survived. They're eclectic.

Authority lies not in the text of your bible but in the whole tradition of your religion. And, believe it or not, the tradition is carried in the hearts of people. Authority lies in the hearts of the believers. The tradition of your religion is what actually gets <u>done</u> right there, day to day in the fields and streets. That's your tradition in the deepest sense. That's where all authority lies. You can be a part of authority by being a part of that.

The Protestant concept of <u>Sola Scriptura</u> (authority lies in printed scripture) was, incontext, nothing more than a political ruse.

The attitude of Zionists and the State of Israel toward the land of Palestine is anti-biological and anti-evolutionary. This attitude is not recent and not confined to the Zionist movement.

The idea of fixed boundaries is obsolete relative to your future and therefore to your present. You're in an electronic surround now. You go and come at will via electronic waves. You can be where you want to be. You can do what you want to do.

Organize it biologically, evolutionarily. That is, make whatever you get more unpredictable than when you got it. Increase its improbability. Make it so that even to yourself, its fashioner, it becomes more than was conceived or expected.

Play games with yourself, trying to surprise yourself with what you do next. Randomize. De-predicate. De-communicate. POTENTIALIZE.

This feed is about the present evolutionary condition of your particular planet. Be alert to it. Strain a little to collect as much of the info that's passing by you as you can. All you need to survive and survive happily is directly in front of you all the time. Select with foresight.

It's always been difficult to clarify the differences between the idea of unity and the idea of diversity. Likewise it's been hard to distinguish between the ideas of full and empty. The key distinction between unity and diversity:

Eventually you're going to get back to process itself. So, if you can, start out where you're going to end up. It's quicker, and you haven't got any time to waste.

Schools are artificial. They're an attempt to abstract, localize and condense process. This can't be done.

The best students are staying out of schools. They're staying in the mother juices -- process.

Krishnamurthi said that the mind is both teacher and pupil.

In place of schools:

- 1- Quick-access, poly-media data banks that vary output according to user feedback. User cost: zero.
- 2- Computer-based programmed learning for all skills compatible with this technique. System should be on-line to any user with a telephone and/or a CRT or a typewriter terminal. Use IBM computer courses as model. User cost: zero. User-paid for each course completed.
- 3- Networks for information describing self-experiences. Any and all experience appropriate. Only it has to be in the first person, singular
- or plural. Accessible for minimal fee. Free to those claiming no cash.
- Juse Whole Earth Catalogue as initial model.
  - 4- Each individual has quick-access to software production and distribution systems for each medium currently in use. Means decentralizing and simplifying production and distribution techniques, making systems
- instantly reprogrammable according to user feedback.

5- Be sensitive to the times when a guru calls you. Chances are he or she will find you within but take you outside of most or all of your external technologies, relying instead on earth's meta-electronic systems. When called, GO!

Most of your church buildings can be converted into something else. Sauna baths, parks, hospitals, jails, computer installations, gymnasiums, museums, houses, video parlors, inns, meeting halls, indoor swimming pools, roller-rinks, bowling alleys.

Ordination for the priesthood or the ministry can be self-administered. If the person has authority others will be attracted. If he doesn't, they won't. Degrees for scholarship can also be self-administered. If you feel you deserve a doctorate, give yourself one, get the robes and organize parades.

Religious schools should close. They were designed for an earlier era. As with all uni-purpose designs, they can not be adapted for other purposes.

If I were you, I'd keep some of the religious orders, Jesuits, Franciscans, Paulists and many of the smaller, service-oriented organizations. However, people in these orders should adopt attitudes appropriate for a time when God Himself walks earth in the flesh.

Francis and Clare are always right. Look to them. Apologize to the chair for sitting on it. Deference.

The mission of the church has been accomplished. Those who wished to hear the Word have heard it. Those who don't wish to hear the Word have made up their minds.

The task for which the church was organized has, therefore, been completed.

You have a choice, as I see it. Creating make-work projects for a few hangers-on -- or disbanding so that other things can evolve. Clearing the field for a new planting, so to speak.

In my view there's considerable merit in simple disbanding.

God will replant the field with a new, different seed.

However, you shouldn't forget things the church has accomplished. You might parallel religious ideas with ideas from cybernetics theory and see what develops.

## For example:

Try treating stories in the Bible as typologies of systems problems. The conflict between Israel and Judah is an attempt to resolve the two realities of centralized and decentralized control functions.

Consider similarities between trinitarian theory and triadic logic such as is being discussed these days. Apply synergy concepts.

Transform the better systematic theologies (Aquinas, Tillich, Barth, Brightman, Calvin) into computer programs and see if they really do process information to your satisfaction.

Compare the processes leading to formulation of liturgies with processes leading to formulation of genetic coding.

Compare the alleged roles of God in relation to man, nature and the universe with the apparent effectiveness of man in relation to the same systems.

Forget sin. You're not born with it and you don't do it.

Sin is a misnomer for what are really errors.

Correct errors. They will all be forgiven.

It won't come as a surprise to some of you that you're composites. Those you call schizophrenics have known this reality.

You draw from any energy source that attracts you. Those that attract you are those that help you to integrate the mix that's you at present.

Thus, as I said before, it should be common and accepted for an individual to claim that he's Napoleon or Jesus Christ. Personally, I'd be careful about making this claim in view of the attitude of certain "authorities" toward such things. But the realism of it can't be denied.

Each of you is literally hundreds of personalities. Hundreds of roles. Hundreds of talents. These many personalities were accumulated over the course of thousands of years, your time, as you traveled through different time-fields and kept meeting energy sources you liked. What you liked you took from and it became a part of you.

Growing up, maturing is the process of letting each of these personalities flower and seek its place in the homeostasis which is you. So let it all hang out. Be everything that's in you. Do whatever you feel like doing. Be all yourselves.

I'll tell you a little secret. There's one over-arching purpose which unites your many selves, and that is, no purpose.
