Teller was responding to the assertion that the USA should forego development of a thermonuclear bomb, the "Super" or H-Bomb, because its lethality makes it immoral.

Teller said, in other words, that if something is possible, no one can prevent it from

happening. Or, what *can* happen *will* happen.

... the English of which is, "S--- happens" ... and ... it behooves one to be prepared to deal with it before it happens, because it will happen.

Of course, preemption, such as is possible, even if in the end a forlorn effort, would be one reasonable way to deal with s--- before it happens.
