McCarthy is right on this point, except, it should have been made two years ago, and ever since, when it was clear this was already here.

What impresses me is not that people are catching on but that they're so late doing it. Late is dead in war. And this has been war for well over a century. Retaking real estate is far more costly and uncertain than holding it. Holding it did not happen, so

retaking it is the only option. Or, of course, ceding it to the invader — which in skilled hands, of course, is a counter-assault.

And still the depth of the matter is not in McCarthy's frame of reference. This isn't socialism. It isn't fascism. It isn't communism. It isn't narcissism (the limpest possible assessment of the situation, pure shrink-ish babbling in ignorance). This isn't egoism. This isn't The Chicago Way. This isn't cynicism. This isn't stupidity. This isn't inexperience. This isn't incompetence or ignorance. This isn't not having a clue.

Every time I hear these utterly fatuous analyses my skin crawls. There is zero insight in them, and more to the point, zero power, intellectual or otherwise. They're all flyers, to use a shooters' term.

McCarthy is right but only as far as he goes, which is not far at all and very, very late to the game, and he is miles short of the target. So he really hasn't said anything helpful or useful or powerful at all. Not even commendable.

Ultimately his analysis here is a "flyer."

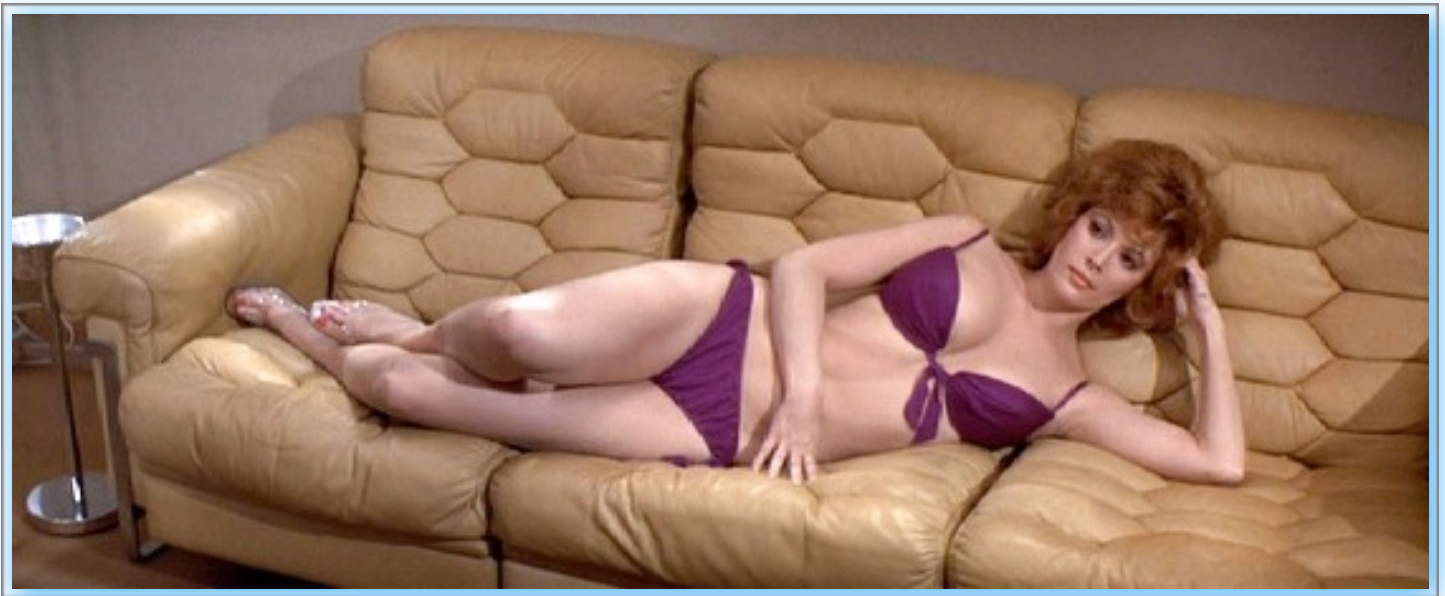


Cowardice, one possible result of fear, is the most despicable of conditions to which man is prone.
